President Report

It was another busy season at Box Hill Cricket Club as we continued to build our club culture alongside eagerly following the progress of the City Oval upgrade. It has not been easy having to play at different venues this season, especially without having a dedicated club space to easily cater for whole club events. We are grateful to Whitehorse Council, Manningham Council, Fitzroy Doncaster Cricket Club, East Box Hill Cricket Club, Whitefriars College and Surrey Hills Cricket Club for their assistance with providing grounds and facilities.

Our priorities this season have been to streamline our processes across the Premier and VSDCA programs and look to build sustainable practices both on and off the field. With this in mind, we have worked to improve our financial management systems through uniform ordering processes, umpire fee payment system, streamlined coach recruitment processes and we will continue to form specific subcommittees where possible to share the day-to-day load on our committee volunteers.

Another key focus during the season was to continue to plan for the club's future direction and working consistently with our neighbouring clubs for shared outcomes. Sharing facilities with Fitzroy Doncaster Cricket Club this season allowed us to explore combining some resources such as coaching and pathways personnel, beginning to work together to deliver high-quality Marg Jennings Tier 1 & 2 experiences for our players. We have also worked to begin a Memorandum of Understanding with the Box Hill Hawks to plan for the shared usage of the newly built West Pavilion, aiming to maximise the usage and sponsorship opportunities which will arise for both clubs in Season 27/28.

This season we also continued to work with East Box Hill Cricket Club to bring our junior sides together to be able to offer a wider range of player pathways and we trialled two joint events with a combined Trivia night and Christmas function. I thank Leearna and her committee at East Box Hill CC for their work in continuing to build this relationship and pathways between the clubs.

This season, we expanded the range of offerings of teams available to players - 3 Premier Women's

teams, 2 joint senior women's teams (one with La Trobe CC and one with East Box Hill CC), 4 Senior VSDCA sides, 4 ISEC junior teams, alongside our representative offerings of the U15 Craig Shield team, U15 Marg Jennings team and U18 Premier team.

Thank you once again to our tireless volunteers who assist in a wide range of roles throughout the season to help get the teams on the grounds each week. Thank you to our committee members – Nicole Breschkin, Steve Flinn, James Box, Leigh Bryant, Pennie Harrison, Apoorv Verma, Philip Hayes and Deepak Sharma for their hard work and dedication this season. Non-committee members who also worked tirelessly behind the scenes in various club roles included Dani Montague, Ken Trollope, Vernon Mittal and Sam Singh, not to mention the parents, coaches, team captains, scorers and sponsors who contributed to the club.

We saw one further Life Memberships announced last season officially awarded to Michael Vozzo. Congratulations to Michael for the recognition of his service and dedication to the club and also for his recent tenure as the Premier women's Head coach for the past two seasons. We wish Michael all the best as he looks to concentrate on growing his business, Fertool, which has been a dedicated sponsor over several seasons. We are also extremely grateful to Robyn Calder for her bequest to the Club to support a female player each year, more details of this is in the Treasurer report.

A huge note of appreciation goes to our coaches across the programs, in particular our Senior Coaches Chris Box (VSDCA) and Michael Vozzo (Premier) for their ongoing commitment to developing our players both on and off the field. Once again, they went above and beyond their coach roles and truly embodied what it means to be club people. It was pleasing to see increased attendance at events this season, with both our club Trivia Night and end of season presentation nights well attended.

Secretary Report

On behalf of the Committee, I am pleased to present the Secretary's report for the 2025–26 season. It has been a season of significant transition for the Club, with the completion of major facility works allowing us to return home. I thank all players, members, volunteers and partner clubs for their support and patience throughout the year.

While the season presented its challenges, the Club was proud to see its Under 17B side claim the premiership in the Cricket Southern Bayside competition, a fantastic achievement and a real highlight of the year for our junior program.

Club participation remained strong throughout the season, with over 200 players registering to play across all grades. Of particular note was the continued growth of our junior program, which welcomed 68 registered junior players, a pleasing sign of the pathway we are building for the Club's future.

Just a couple of exciting things happening at the club this year were:

- Completion of the new South Pavilion and the redevelopment of City Oval, allowing the Club to return to playing at home from next season and to begin using our new clubrooms.
- A successful Trivia Night held jointly with East Box Hill Cricket Club (EBHCC), and a well-attended Christmas Party, both strengthening connections across our playing group and members.
- The introduction of a new community side, competing in our Premier program under the banner of EBHCC, extending playing opportunities for our members.
- A successful Presentation Night held at Box Hill Golf Club, celebrating the achievements of players and teams across the season.

It was a great privilege to welcome Michael Vozzo as a new Life Member of the Club this season, in recognition of his outstanding and long-standing contribution. Congratulations, Michael, on this well-deserved honour.

This season asked a great deal of our Club, and I would like to sincerely thank the members of the Committee for their tireless work and dedication throughout what was a difficult year while our home ground was unavailable. I would also like to extend my sincere thanks to East Box Hill Cricket Club (EBHCC) and Forest Hill/Regional District Cricket Club (FRDCC) for so generously accommodating our Club during this period; their support did not go unnoticed and was greatly appreciated by our players, coaches and members.

I would also like to make special mention of Phillip Hayes, who stepped down from the Committee this season. On behalf of the Club, I thank Phillip sincerely for his service and dedication during his time on the Committee, and for the contribution he has made to Box Hill Cricket Club.

With our new facilities now complete and City Oval ready for use, the Club is well placed to build on this season's foundations. I look forward to a strong 2026–27 season back home at City Oval.

Treasurer's Report

From a financial perspective, the financial year ended 30 June 2026 should be regarded as a strong result, despite the challenges encountered during the 2025/2026 season.

With the club displaced from Box Hill City Oval due to the ground redevelopment, the Premier, VSDCA and Junior programs were conducted across multiple locations, providing limited opportunities for the club to come together.

Despite these challenges, the club achieved an operating profit before tax for the year of \$5,858 from normal cricket operations, compared with an operating profit before tax of \$37,375 for the year ended 30 June 2025.

It is noted that the audited financial statements do in fact reflect an operating profit before tax of \$423,539, which includes extraordinary income of \$417,681 received as a bequest under the Last Will and Testament of Robyn Katrina Calder.

Robyn Calder was a Life Member of Box Hill Cricket Club, Cricket Victoria and the Victorian Women's Cricket Association. She made a significant contribution to the club, including as part of the group responsible for relocating the Premier Women's Program to Box Hill in 1992/93, serving as Club Vice President from 1996 to 2004, contributing as a Committee Member for 15 years, winning two premierships, and earning the 2nd XI and 3rd XI Batting Average awards.

Upon finalisation of Robyn's estate, Box Hill Cricket Club received a total of \$417,681. In accordance with her Will, these funds must be applied for the benefit of women's cricket through sponsorship of female players to support and develop their careers. Specifically, the Will states that the funds are:

- a) For the benefit of one female player per season;
- b) To be held in a separate account/fund in the name of Box Hill Cricket Club Incorporated and shall not be combined with other monies standing to the credit of the club; and

c) The expenditure in the form of sponsorship shall be approved by three female Life Members at the club.

To give effect to Robyn's wishes and to comply with the requirements of the Will, two additional accounts were opened with Bendigo Bank. One account, an Everyday Account (30 June 2026 balance: \$5,636), was established to hold short-term cash to support sponsorship of a nominated player, and a term deposit (30 June 2026 balance: \$412,000) was established to generate interest income on the remaining balance.

Excluding these funds, the club's operating cash position as at 30 June 2026 improved further to \$72,324, up significantly from \$50,614 as at 30 June 2025.

The following key points are highlighted with respect to the financial results:

- Junior subscriptions increased by \$6,118, reflecting four junior teams across the Boys U13, U15 and U17 Sunday morning competition age groups.
- The Premier Program recorded a \$5,083 increase in subscriptions, largely driven by additional registrations secured through the La Trobe University Cricket Club and East Box Hill CC partnerships. This was partially offset by \$2,375 in payments to La Trobe University Cricket Club to assist with the cost of balls, equipment and related items.
- Merchandise and apparel generated a net contribution of \$2,387 in FY26, representing a substantial improvement on the net loss of \$2,249 recorded for this line item in FY25.
- The club's absence from City Oval had a significant impact on social function and bar income, which was \$13,250 lower than FY25. Notwithstanding this, social fundraising income increased by \$4,151, with the Trivia/Auction Night and Reverse Raffle proving particularly successful.
- Ground rental and pavilion costs were also \$5,743 lower than FY25. The combined cost of Schramms and Whitefriars ground hire was \$20,535. In addition, the club continued to benefit from no curation or ground hire costs at Springfield Park,



representing a further saving of approximately \$8,000 to \$10,000.

Overall, the club has worked diligently to restore its cash position over the past two financial years. It is worth noting that, as at 30 June 2024, the club did not hold sufficient cash to cover its largest operating expense.

The club has now established a financial buffer to manage unexpected events and, importantly, has greater capacity to reinvest across all programs.

The reintroduction of City Oval ground and curation fees in the 2026/27 season, followed by Springfield Park in 2027/28, means the club must remain financially disciplined in managing expenses while maximising existing revenue streams and developing new ones. Sponsorship remains the most significant opportunity in this regard, together with a potential

commercial relationship with Box Hill Hawks, which is currently being formalised.

I would like to thank the Committee and all club members for their ongoing support. I look forward to the club's return to City Oval in the 2026/27 season and to the opportunity to bring the club back together.

Financial Bequest from Robyn Calder

Box Hill Cricket Club wishes to acknowledge an extraordinary act of generosity from Life Member Robyn Calder. Robyn, who passed away in December 2023, left a substantial financial bequest to the Club.

In accordance with Robyn's Will, these funds must be applied for the benefit of women's cricket in the form of a sponsorship of female players to nurture and develop their careers. Specifically, the Will states that the funds are:

- c) For the benefit of one female player per season;
- c) To be held in a separate account/fund in the name of Box Hill Cricket Club Incorporated and shall not be combined with other monies standing to the credit of the club; and
- c) Expenditure in the form of the sponsorship shall be approved by three female Life Members at the Club.

This final act of generosity to our Club and women's cricket is entirely consistent with Robyn's character. Robyn had an enduring passion for women's cricket and our Club. She featured in the cricketing journey of so many players at this Club, and now she will continue to do so for many years to come.

Robyn was part of the group responsible for relocating the Premier Women's Program to Box Hill in 1992/93. She also held just about every role there is to hold on and off the field at Box Hill Cricket Club. On-field, she was a player, a premiership player (in both the 1992/93 Women's 2nds side and the 2001/02 Women's 3rds side), a captain, a premiership captain (for the 2001/02 flag), and a coach of the Girls U17s. Off-field, Robyn held the roles of Vice-President, Secretary, Committee Member, selector and Women's First XI Scorer. Robyn's vast and sustained contribution was recognised with the Club's highest honour of life membership in 2003.

Robyn's contributions to Box Hill Cricket Club were in addition to her various cricketing roles elsewhere,

including as an administrator with the VWCA, an umpire and as an author on women's cricket.

Robyn's gift stands as a testament both to the meaningful role the Club played in her life, but also to the enormous contribution she made to our Club.

Robyn's gift will support opportunities for current and future female members, strengthening the foundations of our Club and cricket in Victoria for years to come. We extend our heartfelt gratitude to Robyn for her final contribution to our Club.

Consideration is being given to the details of the sponsorship, including the application process, criteria and amount of the sponsorship to paid each season, and an announcement will be made in due course. We look forward to celebrating Robyn's generous gift for years to come.





Premier Head Coach Report

During the off-season we were extremely fortunate to appoint Steve Watling as Assistant/2nd XI Coach and to gain the services of Dylan Smith as 3rd XI Coach. Furthermore, Pennie Harrison took on the role of Net Captain, which allowed the coaches the opportunity to focus more heavily on coaching tasks during training.

Unfortunately, the 2025/26 season for our women's program delivered mixed on-field results, with none of our Premier teams making finals. However, the retention of players from the previous season, along with a major influx of new and promising players, allowed us to field an additional team in partnership with East Box Hill CC and supply up to five players to Latrobe University. The East Box Hill team finished on top of the ladder but unfortunately lost the semi-final in extremely controversial circumstances.

Playing and training away from our normal home venue presented challenges, but it was no excuse for our inconsistent form. I would like to sincerely thank Michael Fletcher (President of Fitzroy/Doncaster CC) and the entire FDCC community for their hospitality and engagement throughout the season. Nothing was ever too difficult for them in assisting us, and we worked seamlessly alongside the men's program in what could potentially be a fitting dress rehearsal for a future move of the women's program.

There were a number of player highlights across the season that deserve recognition:

The success of the joint team with EBHCC, which was managed sensationally on match days by EBHCC President Leearna Wilson, her partner Brett Curtis, and club stalwart Paul Byrne. We thank them for their coordination and ongoing support.

Hayley Tasker took on the role of Captain for the EBHCC team and led from the front with terrific form and excellent leadership. She maintained strong standards around punctuality while also

demonstrating impressive tactical awareness. Alongside the great support of Izzy Gillespie, both have shown they are future leaders of the club.

Zoe Griffiths and Yosh Senarathne continued their excellent form throughout the season and were both rewarded with selection in the end-of-season All Stars v Victorian 2nd XI series, placing them firmly in the sights of Victorian selectors.

Trisha Bajaj gained selection for the Northern Territory for the second consecutive year in the National Under-16 Championships.

There were greatly improved series from the Marg Jennings Under-15 and Under-18 teams under the guidance of Wayne Stewart, Isa White, Vaish Munukutla, Chloe Blacker, and Alana Bond.

Guhika Vij and Grace Hourigan made their First XI debuts following terrific form in the 2nd XI and a tremendous work ethic at training.

Chloe Blacker, despite playing only a handful of games due to a significant injury, continued to assist and support the club whether at training or on game day. Although she is new to the club, I think we may have uncovered a Mustang for life.

Dani Montague may claim she is getting older, but she produced one of her better seasons, taking 24 wickets across the T20 and One-Day formats to become the club's leading wicket-taker.

There were, of course, many other strong performances throughout the season, and as a coach it was extremely pleasing to witness them. However, what I enjoy most is seeing players who work hard at their game genuinely enjoying their time at training and playing on Sundays with their teammates. The unity and culture that has been created over the past two years has been particularly satisfying and rewarding for both myself and the entire club.

Seeing parents prepared to roll up their sleeves to score, cook a BBQ, assist with covers, and support



the club ensures that the culture we are building continues to thrive into the future.

I now conclude my two-year tenure as coach due to increasing work commitments. While I may get a little grumpy at times, I have thoroughly enjoyed leading the women's program and, more importantly, watching the strong bonds formed among the players. I genuinely believe the program is now in a strong position for my successor and their assistants to continue progressing the group toward future success and individual growth.

Thank you to Club President Lisa White, Women's Administrator Leigh Bryant, and the rest of the committee for their support, encouragement, and tireless work behind the scenes to ensure players, parents, and coaches experience the best possible club environment. Winning the First XI premiership last season was a fantastic achievement, but it has been even more rewarding to help develop a strong cultural shift that now sees us with a large and highly talented playing group at Box Hill.

Thank you also to Steve Watling and Pennie Harrison for their commitment and work ethic in ensuring training sessions were well organised and that players had every opportunity to develop their skills. Likewise, thank you to Dylan Smith for his leadership and support of Eleanor in the 3rd XI. A special thank you also to Anna Lanning for her willingness to step in and assist the team whenever needed. Your support, enthusiasm, and commitment throughout the season were greatly appreciated by the players and coaching staff alike.

To our captains – Vaish Munukutla, Eleanor Forwood, Bri Humphreys-Crouch, Nic Breschkin, Alex Elliott, Hayley Tasker, and Izzy Gillespie – thank you for your leadership and your willingness to prioritise team opportunities, often placing the development of others ahead of your own game.

Finally, to the parents who have supported and engaged with me over the past two years, thank you. Issues have been minimal, and those who were not aligned with the direction of the program have moved on, leaving behind a highly supportive and

proactive group. I encourage those who have not yet become actively involved to do so next season, as building a stronger community of volunteers will be vital for the future.

While I may no longer be coaching, I will always remain a Box Hill Cricket Club person and will continue to be around to witness first-hand the ongoing growth of both the players and the community that has been built.

Premier Third XI Report

For the bowling, Isabel Wheeler led the wicket-takers with 14 wickets for the season at an economy of 4.50, with best figures of 3/20 against Plenty Valley in Round 16.

Lily Elder was close behind with 13 wickets, including the best bowling figures of the season, 4/10, in the win over Greenvale in Round 9. Evelyn Thomson was incredibly economical, taking 10 wickets at an outstanding average of 12.90 and economy of 3.66, with best figures of 3/9 against Dandenong in our 55-run win in Round 14. Keeratjot Kaur was tidiest with the ball, going for just 3.04 runs an over across her spells, with a best of 3/8 against Plenty Valley in Round 16. Aaliyah Terbeeke rounded out the attack with 9 wickets for the season, best figures 2/20 against EMP in Round 5.

It was a season of contrasts. Our two most emphatic performances - the 96-run win over Plenty Valley in

Round 4 built on Varsha's 54 not out, and the 79-run win over EMP in Round 17 powered by Grace's 60 - showed what the side is capable of when we build defendable scores around key batters. The win over Greenvale in Round 9, sealed by Lily's 4/10, was a great example of the bowling group taking the game away from the opposition. Most of the losses during the season were due to issues combining batting and bowling performances, demonstrating the importance of teamwork and consistency. There were many achievements to celebrate and more learnings to take into the season ahead.

Premier U18 Representative Competition

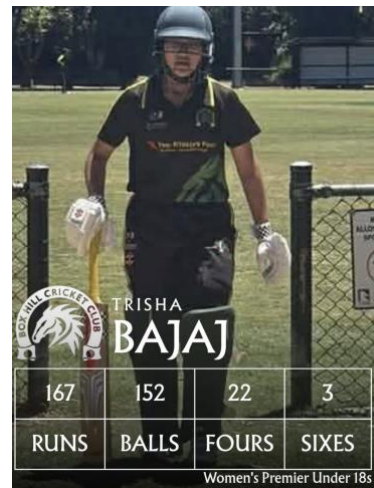
